# Cave Paintings: Pre-historic Art

- Found on almost every continent
- Oldest ones 35,000 yrs old...but most 9,000-15,000
- Images of hunting, daily activities, some more symbolic and less realistic



# Why did they paint the caves? What do the paintings mean?

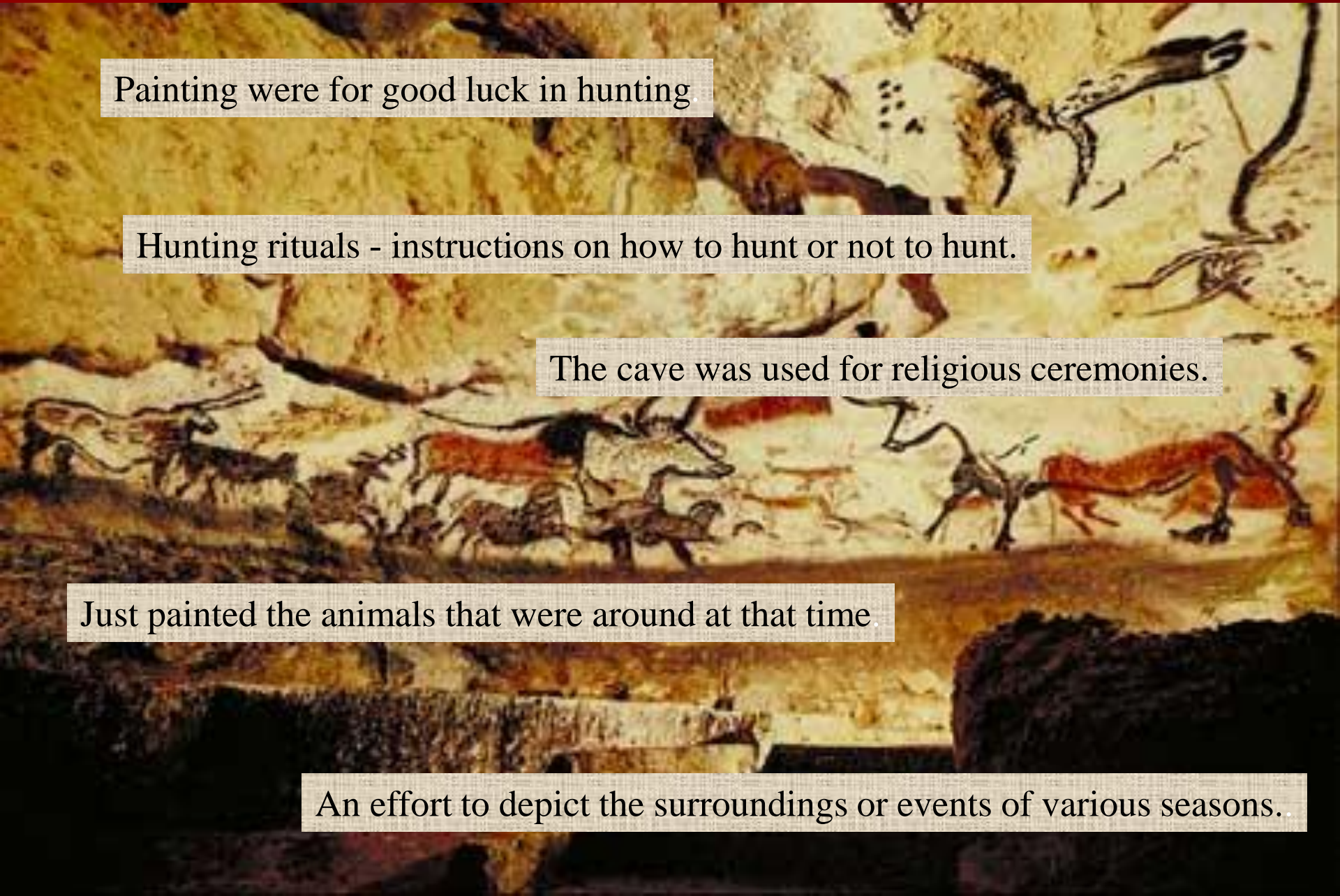
Painting were for good luck in hunting.

Hunting rituals - instructions on how to hunt or not to hunt.

The cave was used for religious ceremonies.

Just painted the animals that were around at that time.

An effort to depict the surroundings or events of various seasons.







In 1994 more than 300 caves, grottoes and roofs with paintings, undoubtedly dated to the Upper Paleolithic, are known in **Europe.**



- Pre-historic artists used 3 basic colors...**yellow**, **black**, and **red**
- obtained from clay, charcoal, minerals, and animal fats
- Often times painted on natural protrusions or swellings to give 3-D effect.









A CAVERN WALL in Europe is decorated with lively animal portraits by skilled Magdalenian artists about 10,000 B.C. Their purpose, it is believed, was not merely to adorn the cave but to propitiate the spirits of animals and

thus assure mastery over them in hunting. For coloring, these experts used mineral oxides and charcoal, with animal fat as a binder. They blew the pigment onto the stone walls through bone tubes, or molded "crayons" with it.

## **Niaux Cave, Russia**

The bison is the main subject of the paintings in the cave. Not a single depiction is repeated twice -- the eyes, nostrils, horns of every animal are painted in a special manner.



## **Cueva de Las Manos—Patagonia, Argentina**

The "Cueva de Las Manos" cave paintings along the Pinturas river: this is the most important cave painting site in whole Patagonia, known throughout the world for its quality and uniqueness.

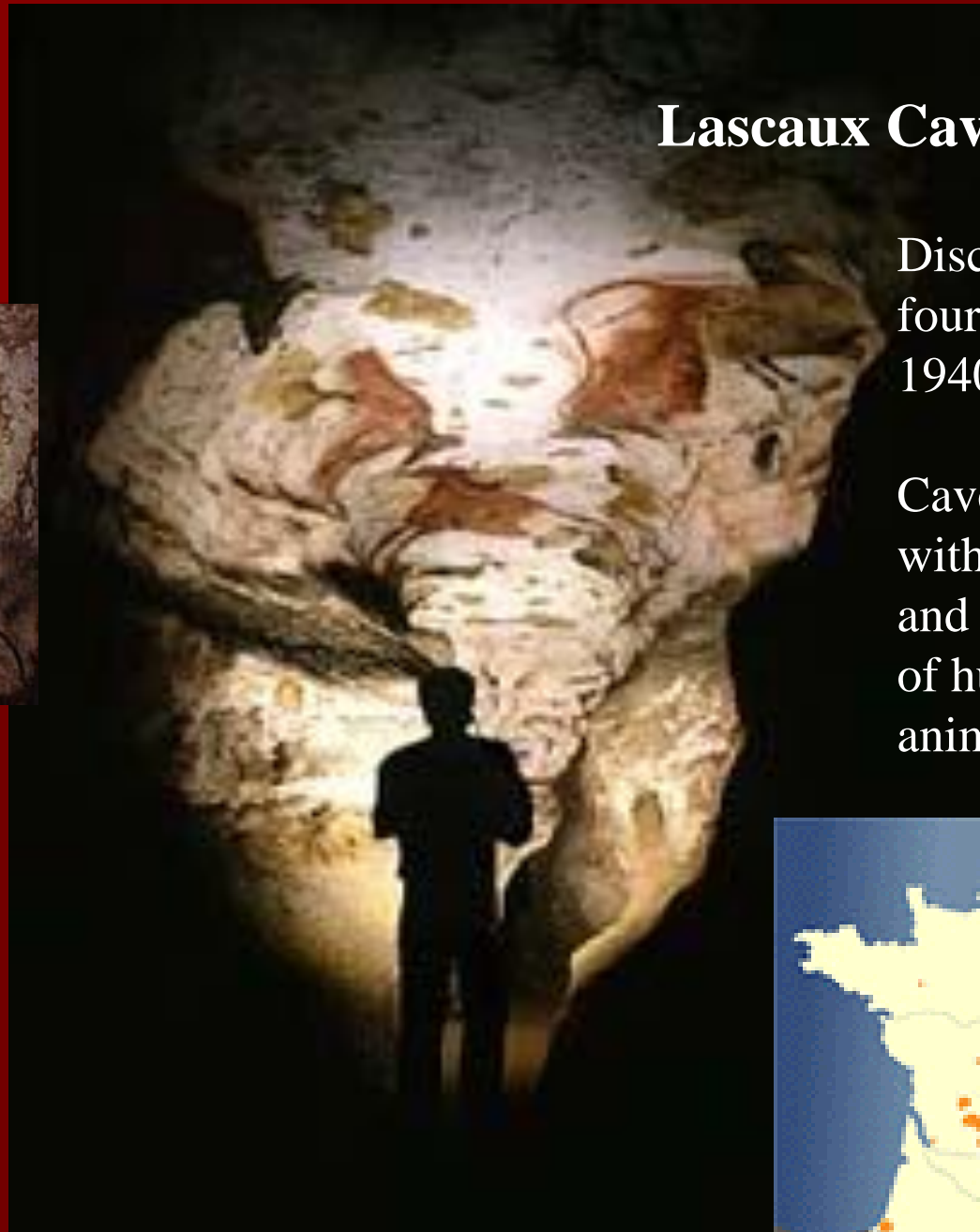

## Lascaux Cave, France

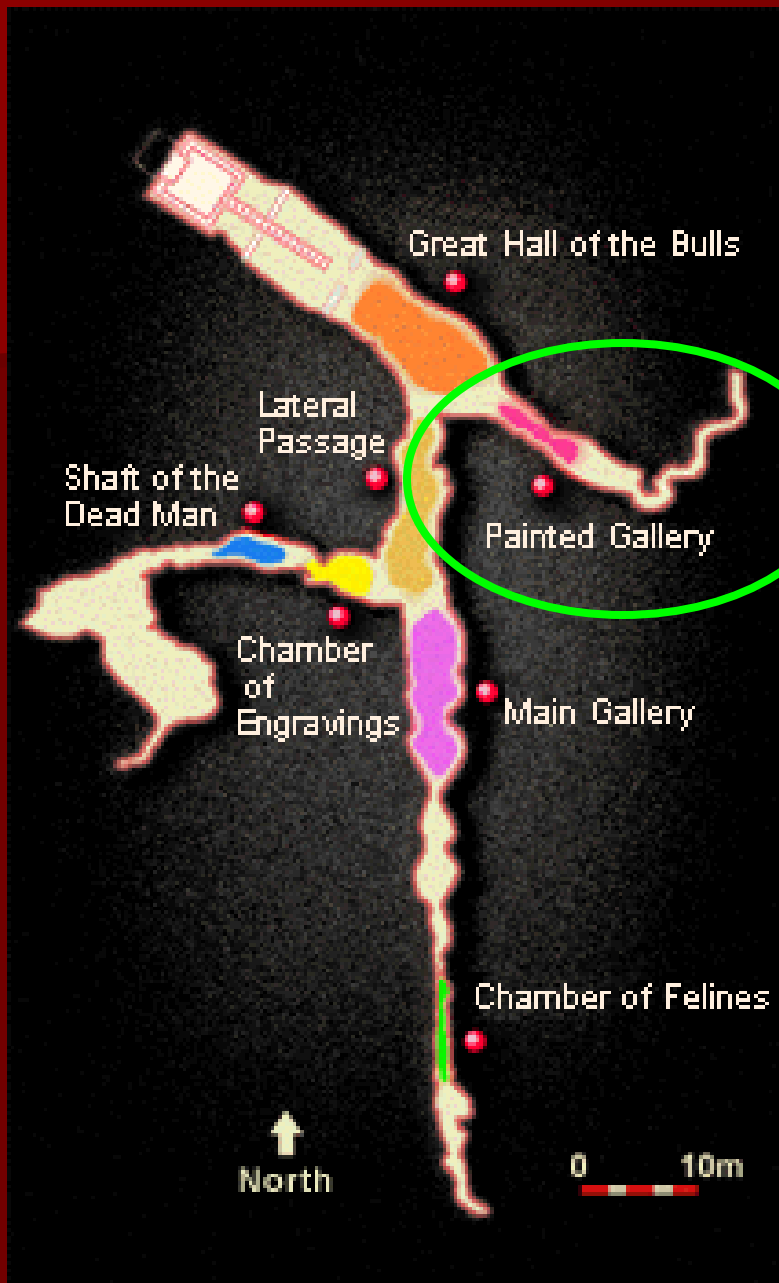
Discovered by four boys in 1940.

Caves are filled with pictographs and petroglyphs of hundreds of animals.



## Lascaux Cave, France (movie tour pt 1)

The Painted Gallery is justifiably considered to be the pinnacle of Paleolithic cave art.





**There are almost 600 pictures of animals, mostly horses.**



**Other animals painted are stags, bulls, bison, and ibex.**



**Only one crude image of a man is painted.**



## Lascaux Cave, France (movie tour pt 2)



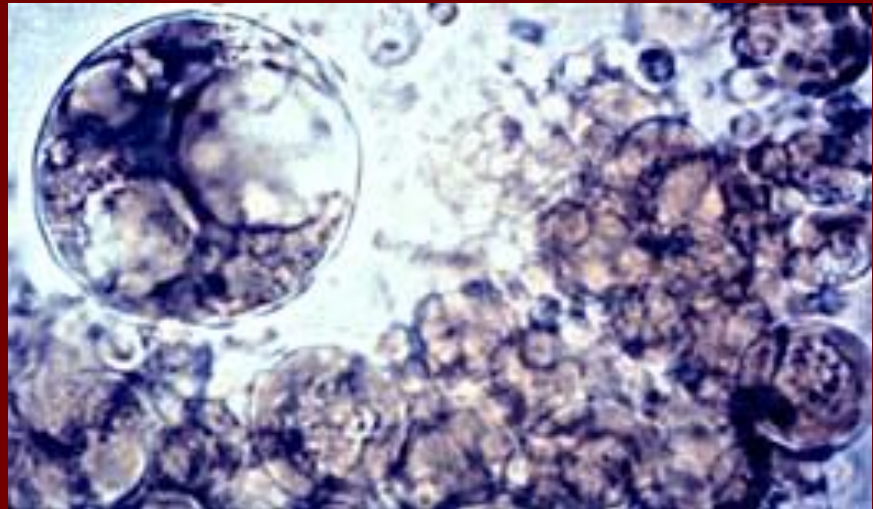
On the right wall, the focal point of the composition, made up of a herd of small horses, is a **large black cow** whose distinguishing feature is an unusual movement evocative of a **fall...**

While, in the front **two ibexes** are confronting each other...



# Problems in Lascaux...

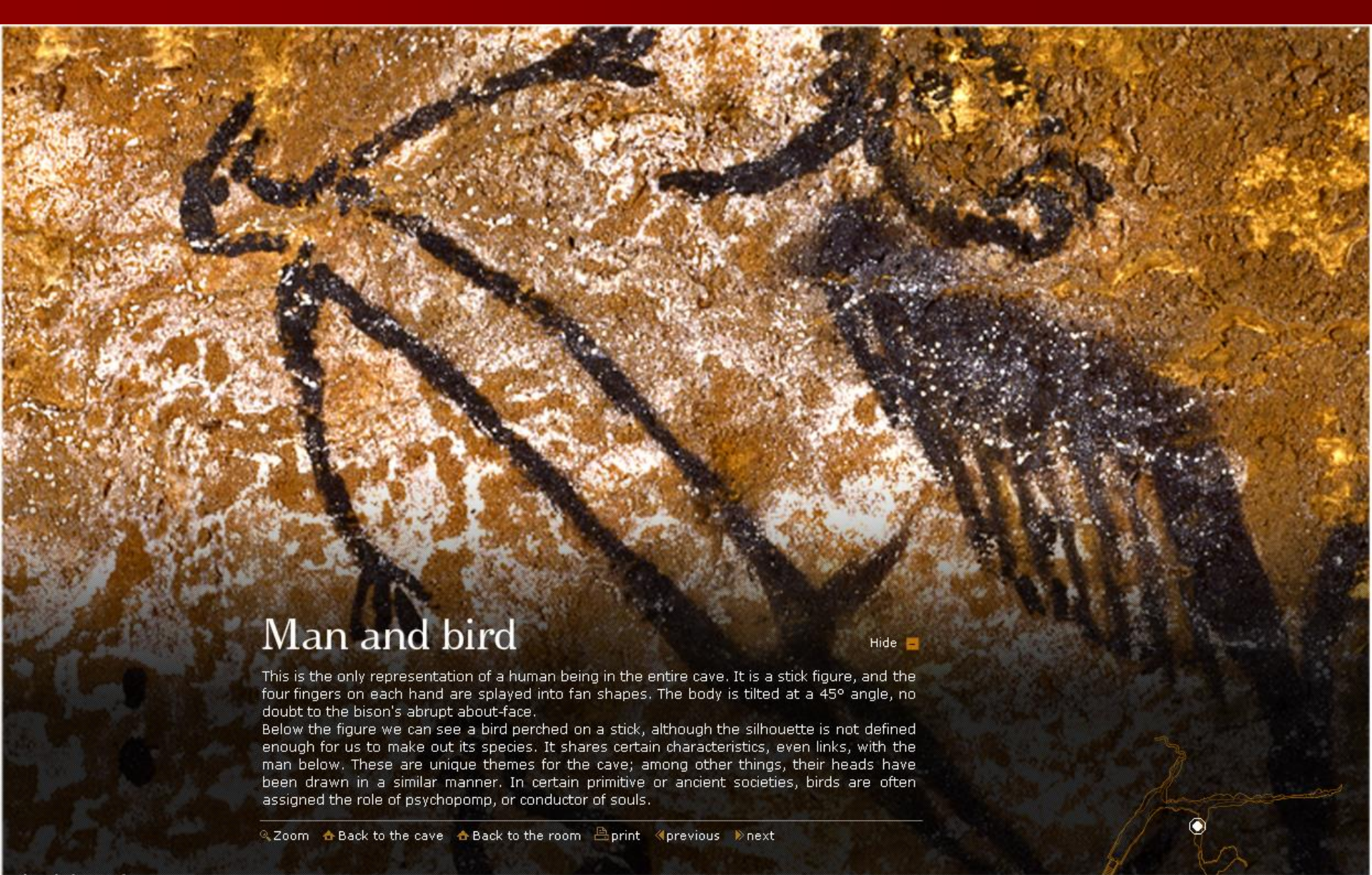
- Human breath ... excess of carbon dioxide
- Corroded the rock and the calcite
- Green algae and mosses...
- System built to stop the deterioration
- Cave was closed to the public in 1963



- 2001 -- colonies of micro-organisms, mushrooms & bacteria developed on the rock edges and on cave floor
- Fungicides and antibiotics, as well as the application of quicklime, were immediately used to treat the affected areas...problem contained
- 1983, Lascaux II opened— replica of Great Hall of Bulls and the Painted Gallery













## Man and bird

Hide 

This is the only representation of a human being in the entire cave. It is a stick figure, and the four fingers on each hand are splayed into fan shapes. The body is tilted at a 45° angle, no doubt to the bison's abrupt about-face. Below the figure we can see a bird perched on a stick, although the silhouette is not defined enough for us to make out its species. It shares certain characteristics, even links, with the man below. These are unique themes for the cave; among other things, their heads have been drawn in a similar manner. In certain primitive or ancient societies, birds are often assigned the role of psychopomp, or conductor of souls.

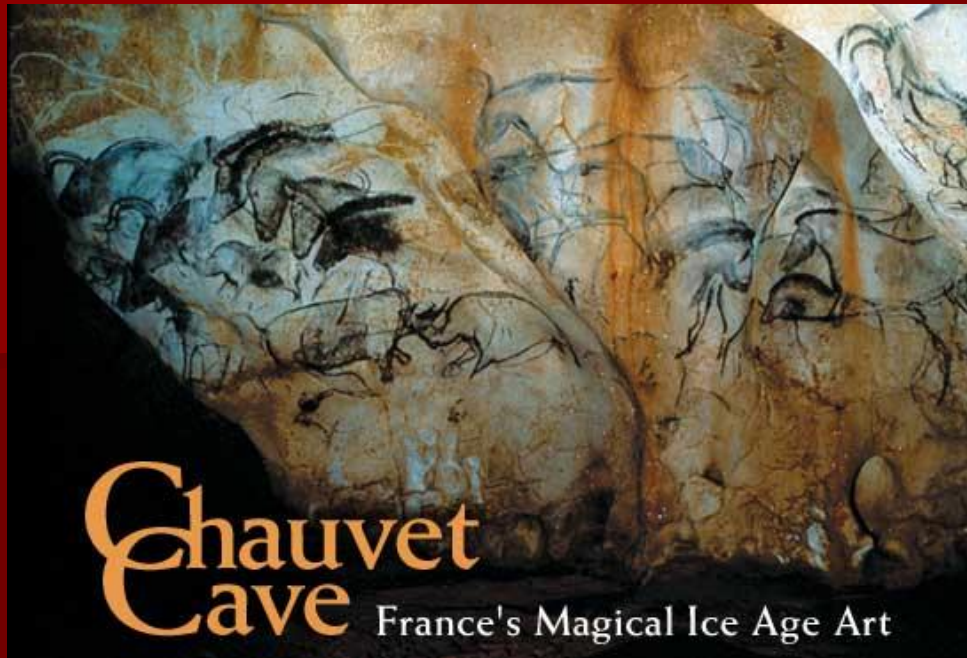

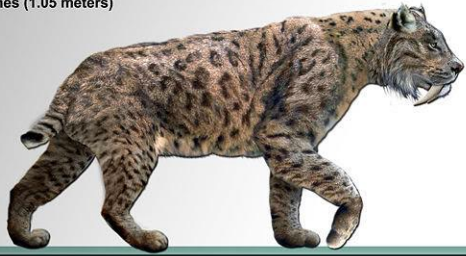


## SABER-TOOTHED CAT - *Smilodon fatalis*

6 feet (1.83 meters)

\*About the size of a modern lion, though more compact and muscular in build  
\*Front "saber" teeth are elongated canines and grow up to 7" in length  
\*Jaw can open an incredible 120 degrees, but is weaker than the jaws of most other cats of equal size  
\*The muscular build suggests an animal that is slower, but more powerful than most cats, making it an exceptional ambush predator

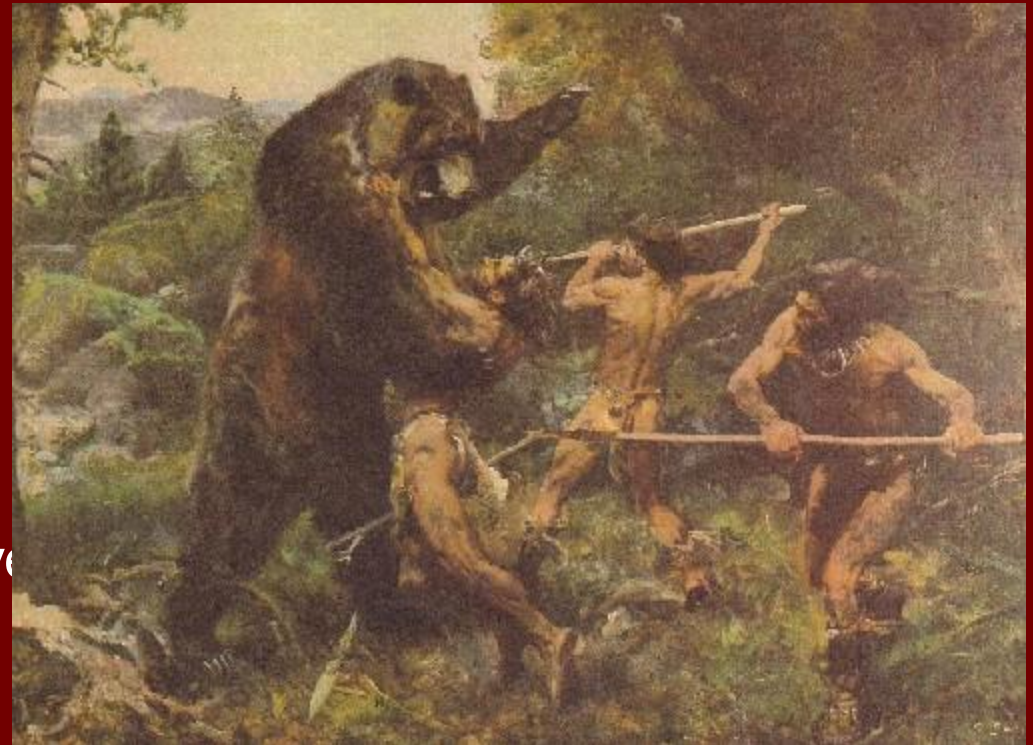

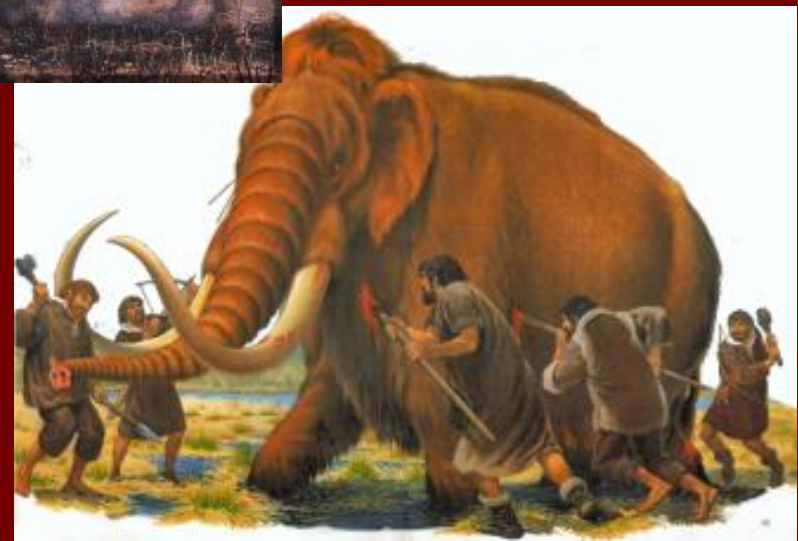

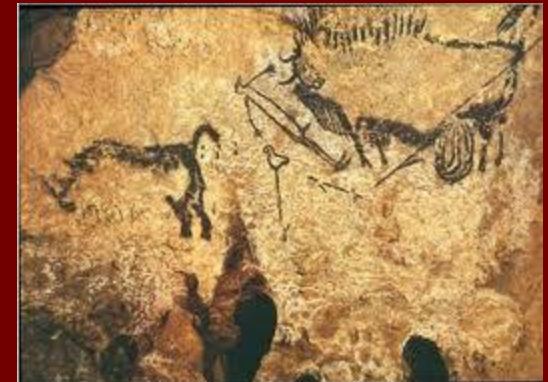

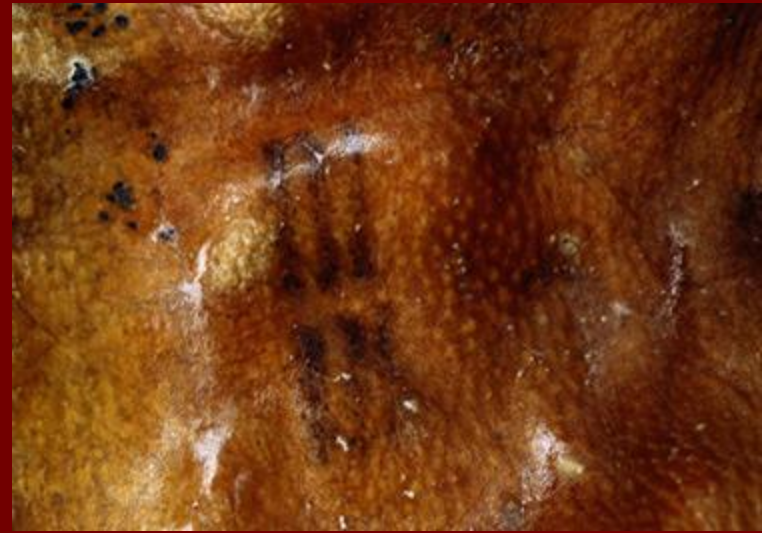




The equipment and clothing of the Iceman are a virtual time-capsule of everyday life – over 70 objects were found associated with him.

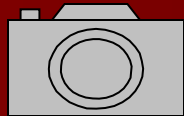
